COLLECTION MANAGEMENT:

Overseeing the display and organization of a vast array of antique tractors, trucks, cars, and related memorabilia.

VISITOR ENGAGEMENT:

Often found on the museum floor, Stone is known for delighting visitors with personal stories and technical insights about the exhibits, helping to bring history to life.

RESTORATION & MAINTENANCE:

Ensuring that most vehicles remain in running order (all but four of the original tractors were driven onto the showroom floor) and had a role in restoring many tractors on display.

ADDING NEW EXHIBITS:

The museum is a constant work in progress, with Stone always on the lookout for new items to add to the dynamic displays.

Bones' deep appreciation for automotive and agricultural history is evident to all who meet him. He is a self-described fan



of anything with a motor and local history, particularly items with local Virginia names. His personal passions are clearly centered around the mechanics and history of the vehicles he curates.

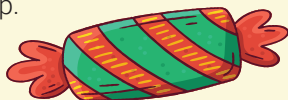
